

National Chaplain, The Most Rev. Shenan Boquet

My dear sisters in Christ, In God's wondrous design, we can see and experience creation moving through seasons, understanding that "There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens" (Ref., Ecclesiastes 3:1-4). In other words, all human things have their season, and the things we go through in life are not without purpose. Covenant House was founded 38 years ago with the mission to help homeless kids. Today, Covenant House is the largest privately-funded agency in the Americas providing food, shelter, immediate crisis care, and essential services to homeless, throwaway, and runaway kids.

SOAR! (Support Our Aging Religious) Was founded in 1986 with \$25,000 seed money received from Catholic Daughters. Augmenting the efforts of the institutional Church, SOAR! is a non-profit organization of persons who are committed to assuring financially stable and personally secure futures for elderly and frail members of Catholic religious congregations.
